## Institutional Achievements:


Our greatest achievement this year has been our going through the 4th Cycle of Reaccreditation by the National Assessment



- and Accreditation Council (NAAC) in these extremely challenging, difficult and unprecedented times. Months of toil, labour and sacrifice finally culminated in the onsite visit by the NAAC Peer Team on the 25th and 26th of February, 2021 two days of exhaustive and intensive discussions, deliberations, inspection and interaction between the Peer Team and faculty and staff of Jyoti Nivas. I am very happy to announce that we secured an A+ grade and Cumulative Grade Point Average (CGPA) of 3.43 on a scale of 4 in the 4th Cycle of Re-accreditation by NAAC in March 2021.
- Another significant achievement of the institution was the launching of the Lumiere application in November 2020. Through this application, students can now access various e-content put out by the institution including syllabi and library resources. The app has enabled both students and teachers to receive timely updates, circulars and notifications from the institution. It is indeed a milestone in the growth and development of the institution.
- The Centre for Media Studies inaugurated various additions to their prestigious department on 25th January, 2021. The new

facilities include a separate staff room for Journalism, a new upgraded News Studio, Advanced Editing Studio and a New Media Lab.

Coursera - Jyoti Nivas College Autonomous collaborated with Coursera. Staff and students joined the platform and completed 6405 courses.

Online teaching brought with it unforeseen challenges. Our staff worked ceaselessly from the time of the first lockdown in March 2020, gearing themselves up for the eventuality of launching into the new semester online. We collaborated with technical service providers, implemented new platforms and got the methodology and supporting technology in place.

The staff underwent **training for online classes** via Microsoft Teams in a 5-day Faculty Development Programme from 9<sup>th</sup> June to 13<sup>th</sup> June, 2020. Microsoft Teams were set up and 3000 logins were created.

Intensive and meaningful virtual **orientations** and interactive sessions with students were carried out periodically to brief them about important issues.

Continuous Internal Assessment, practical examinations, project viva, end semester examinations, supplementary exams and special supplementary exams, Boards of Studies meetings and the 17<sup>th</sup> Academic Council Meeting have been conducted online successfully.

Regular staff meetings, departmental meetings and meetings of various committees to chalk out academic, co-curricular and extra-curricular activities for the academic year 2020-2021 on the virtual MS Teams platform kept us all united in spirit.

The Covid crisis has not blunted our keenness to share and gather knowledge. Research and publication have gone on alongside teaching and evaluation. 42 papers were presented and 2 books, 6 chapters to published books and 56 papers were published.

Webinars have become the trend now. We conducted 27 webinars in the period June 2020 to May 2021 to facilitate continued exchange of ideas and expertise inspite of restrictions on physical proximity. Resource persons and experts in various fields from India and abroad were roped in for the purpose.

Among the **myriad webinars** conducted since June 2020, the most significant was the 2-day **National webinar on the National Education Policy, NEP**, titled "The Trajectory of Academic Development: The Thrust of the National Education Policy (NEP)", on Sept 22-23, 2020; and a 5-day Faculty Development Programme and **International webinar on Covid-related issues**, titled "Reconfiguring the Mind: Post-COVID Consciousness", June 23 – 27, 2020.

In order to make sure that our students do not miss out on the opportunity of electing representatives of their choice to form the Student Council, which leads the student body in all sports and cultural activities, the college conducted online **Student Council elections**, through Google forms. Approximately 2700 students actively participated in the process of virtual voting for the Student Union.

A **Leadership Camp** for the newly-elected Student Council and Class and Sports Representatives and an **Investiture Ceremony** were also held.

To ensure that our students' overall holistic development through cultural activities is not hampered by Covid restrictions, the Student Union organized Rhapsody 2021, online interclass cultural activities.

Celebrations of Independence Day, Foundation Day, Teachers' Day and Christmas on a virtual platform expanded creative expressions beyond our own expectations, bringing together the staff and entire student body in a mood of joy, harmony and gratitude.

Jyoti Nivas College Autonomous along with its academic excellence also aims to provide career guidance and placements. Due to Covid restrictions this year, all the trainings and drives were conducted online. 55% of registered students are placed.

The **Social Action Forum** of Jyoti Nivas College comprising of the AICUF, NSS, NCC, E-Cell and Rotaract Club, carried out several outreach programs, both real and virtual, to create social awareness among our students and sensitize them to social issues.

In Jyoti Nivas College, students are provided with various **support facilities**. Our **Counseling Centre** focuses on attending to student problems and enhancing their confidence and self-esteem

and fostering life-skills in them. During the pandemic, we reached out virtually to help every student find reassurance and faith in a better future.

Book Bank provisions, Scholarships, Remedial coaching/classes and many other facilities are made available to socially and economically less privileged students through the **Student Welfare Committee**. The library constantly provided them online books and articles.

The mental health and well-being of our students being our topmost priority, the staff and mentors were regularly in touch with their students and wards via WhatsApp, phone calls and mails; talking to them, reassuring them, giving them advice, courage and hope, boosting their morale and keeping their spirits up in these troubled and testing times. Online Mentor-ward meetings were also held.

In March 2020, when the nation went into lockdown mode, the great need of the hour was to reach out to the poor, less privileged people - the migrant labourers, construction workers, footpath vendors, street hawkers, sweepers, pourkarmikas, garbage clearance workers, slum dwellers, Class IV workers, families of JNC employees, families of JNC students, security personnel - those who were most severely impacted by the lockdown and the pandemic. Jyoti Nivas provided food grains and groceries, financial support and medical assistance to 220 families from St. Anthony's Parish, Little Sisters

of the Poor and other NGOs - to the tune of Rs.

Covid testing drives and vaccination drives were conducted on the college premises as per Government of Karnataka guidelines.

We bid a fond farewell to two of our beloved staff who have attained superannuation in Jyoti Nivas College. Dr. Geeja S Kurian, Head of the Department of Botany and Biotechnology and Ms Genevieve of the Department of Commerce and Management. Our heartfelt thanks to them for their unwavering support and service to Jyoti Nivas College. Jyoti Nivas College appreciates their commitment. We pray for their good health and peace as they begin their second innings in life.

We deeply mourn the passing away of 4 pillars of our Jyoti Nivas Community - Sr Philomena Cardoza, former Principal, Jyoti Nivas College, in July 2020, Sr Josephine Hoover, Animator, Jyoti Nivas Community, in April 2021, Sr Lucy Pinto, Animator, Jyoti Nivas Community in May 2021 and Dr. Sr Elizabeth C S, Principal, Jyoti Nivas College in June 2021. An era has ended. Jyoti Nivas will never be the same without them. They will continue to live in our memories. But memories fade with time. The true testimony to their eternal presence is the home of God above, our hearts below, and every brick and stone and blade of grass that makes up this great institution - Jyoti Nivas.

It is now time to place on record my sincere thanks and heartfelt gratitude to each and everyone of my faculty and staff for their unwavering support, indefatigable commitment and unstinted loyalty to the institution inspite of herculean challenges and in the face of great odds.
