The College has been re-accredited by NAAC with ‘A’ Grade and UGC has conferred the college as **“College with Potential for Excellence”**

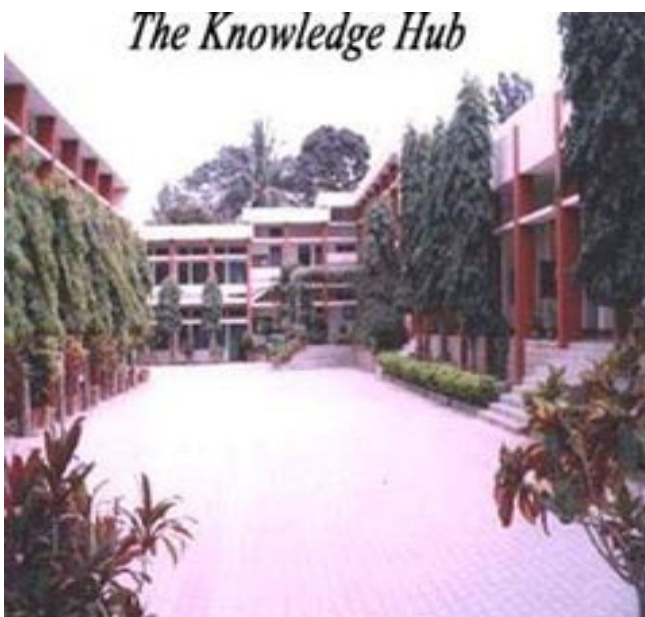
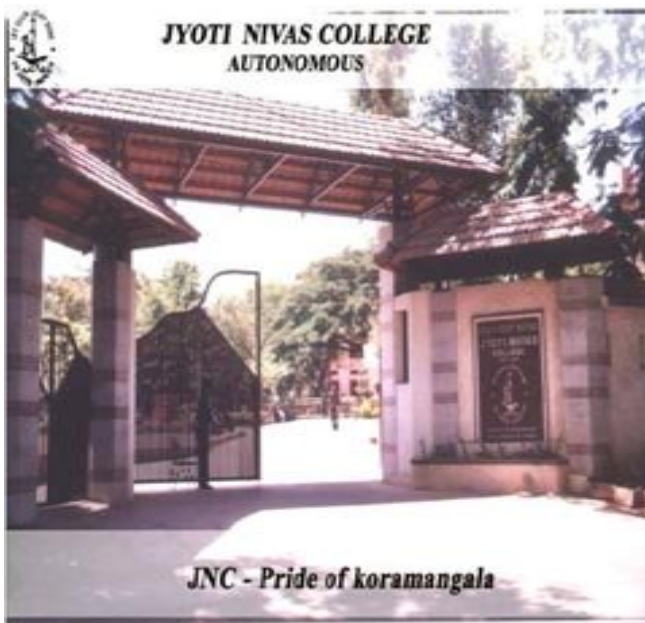
Jyoti Nivas College enjoys an Academic Autonomous status.

GOALS

The long-term objective of the Pathways Program is to achieve global standards of excellence in education, training and research and to strengthen the academic and physical infrastructure.

Pathways program aims to increase the admission of marginalized students and improve the higher education admission policies because there are number of students who are bright and intelligent but had to drop out due to lack of financial resources.

Our Pathways Program aims to improve and develop student's academic and social supports and improve the educational opportunities especially for marginalized students

Pathways Program aim to improve the faculty and thereby improving the Curriculum, which automatically results in improved educational standards and thereby increases cultural awareness and inclusiveness.

Our Pathways Program promotes skills oriented programmes like enhancement of Presentation skills, Personality development, instilling confidence among Scholars and value added courses in order to enable the students in multitasking.

Our aim is to start new extension programs for challenged and marginalized students and to organize various awareness programmes like child labour, adult education, education for people living in slums, empowerment of women etc.

POPULATION

The Pathways Program seeks to serve various groups of young students. The programme has reached out to students not only in Karnataka but Andhra Pradesh, Tamil Nadu and Kerala as well. Intensive course was given to these students and other students from indigenous population .We have direct contact with them and we also have strong *Alumni Association* who are in the state of continuous interaction with them and give them latest updates.

The students having potential for higher learning but having no adequate income are the chief beneficiaries of Pathways Program.

OUTCOME

Pathways Program has been result oriented right from the day of its inception in 2003. It is highly gratifying that because of this program the student's dreams are coming true. Having done well in their studies and achieved distinctions and gold medals, they have found good place in the educational institutions and industries as well. Lots of scholars benefited through Pathways Program have got into professional courses and are competent Doctors and Engineers at present. Among them some are working in reputed Software Companies like IBM, SATYAM, INFOSYS, TCS and WIPRO etc. Various group discussions, seminars and debates were organized where students especially Pathways Beneficiaries participated and there was more interaction among them, which resulted in building their self-confidence. They shared and expressed their points of view and then the teachers cum counselors channelized their viewpoints for their betterment.

Remedial Course in English Language and communication was conducted for three Months, which enhanced the language and communication skills of the students. Remedial classes were also conducted by the Department of Mathematics where Students improved their basic Mathematical skills. In addition to it six months Computer Literacy and Networking Course was conducted which proved very beneficial. More over Pathways students have achieved better grades in all the Programmes.

New PG Programs like MBA, MCA and UG Programs like BBM, B Sc Bio-technology and BA Communicative English have been started and as a result of it more students are entering and graduating from the institution. The number of students entering and graduating from this institution is increasing year after year. It was 1400 in 2003 and is 2400 in 2008. One of the objectives of new courses is to keep some seats reserved for some Pathways scholars.

Numbers of faculty members within and outside the college are invited to train students in their skills for a prospective career and pathways financial aid was given as honorarium fee for the experts.

There are very few sources of financial aid to students. The chief among them are University Grants Commissions and Pathways. In addition to it Government is also providing scholarships to reserved category of students, which is quite meager. If more funds would have been available, more students would be benefited.
