### **Introduction**

The Rangers Unit of Jyoti Nivas College Autonomous visited Koramangala Government School on 12th August 2025 at 9.30a.m. A group of around 21 Ranger students, along with 4 faculty members participated in the activity. The purpose of the visit was to engage the students of the Government school and encourage creativity and learning through interactive games.

Around 60 students of 8<sup>th</sup> standard participated in this interactive event, where students have to pick a topic of their choice and to narrate a story in any of the three language- English, Hindi or Kannada.
